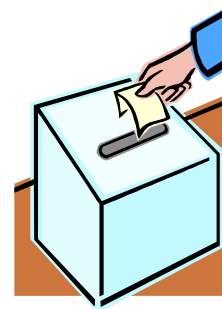

***Fundamental Political Principles
Of the United States Government***

Shutter fold Book with Top opening flap Insets:

1. Make a shutter fold booklet. (Fold hamburger style once, and then again. You should have a four column piece of paper.) Open and lay flat. Bring the two edges to the center crease and crease the edges. It should open like a shutter.
2. Make two flap strips. Fold one piece of paper hotdog style. Keeping the crease at the top, fold hamburger style, and then again. KEEP THE CREASE UP, and "trim" the sides and bottom, no more than a 1/4" on any side. This will give you 4 flaps. Repeat.
3. Cut out each block of information and the building to the left. Students will glue the principles to the front of the flap, match the correct information and glue under the flap. Once completed, the students will glue flip books to the inside of the shutter.
4. Glue the building on the front of the book, and carefully cut in half at the opening so that the book will open properly.
5. Glue the book into notebook or save for review.
